Apart from being used in the pure form, Emu Oil is also used in the cosmetic and medical fields. Emu Oil is a good emulsifier - it has the ability to blend oil and water together and produce a cream that does not feel oily on the skin.

History

The emu (*dromaius nova hollandiae*) is the second largest flightless bird in the world and belongs to the ratite group which also includes the ostrich, rhea, cassowary and kiwi.

The Emu is native to Australia. Emus are farmed in Australia and indeed throughout the world under strict licensing conditions for their oil, meat, leather, eggs and feathers. One emu will produce on average the following :

- * 10-15 kg of dark red meat (similar looking to steak)
- * 10 kg of fat (which renders down to approx. 7 litres of oil)
- * approx. 7 square feet of body leather

The meat is used by restaurants and is available through selected meat stores & supermarkets. Emu leather is used to make a range of items including wallets, purses, belts, leather jackets, handbags, shoes & boots etc.

The emu egg has seven different layers of colour through the eggshell ranging from the dark outside green through to white inside - this enables them to be carved. The emu eggs are also used for painting, egg artistry and as decorations.

Emu feathers are used for decoration and by the clothing industry. Emu oil has many uses, some of them are described in this brochure.
